Concert4aCause #30 presents **VOX3MACHINA**, a classical trio featuring saxophonist Timothy McAllister, bass trombonist Randall Hawes and pianist Kathryn Goodson, to celebrate the work of the **Leslie Science & Nature Center**. This nonprofit environmental organization, now in partnership with the Ann Arbor Hands-On Museum, has helped to raise awareness and deep appreciation of the natural world in thousands of families and children throughout southeast Michigan and beyond. Nestled just two blocks from Northside Community Church and Ann Arbor STEAM School, the LSNC seeks to nurture the legacy of an astonishing, generous couple, Dr. and Mrs. Leslie. For the Leslie's, the calm, meditative world view empowered by an appreciation of nature should be the birthright of every child.

LIGHTRAYS, drawing on musical traditions of Gospel, Blues and Ray Charles, was composed for VOX3MACHINA in 2018 by University of Michigan Professor, Stephen Rush. Another capstone work of the program is **MAHOGANY MOODS**, written for the trio in 2016 by Chicago composer Jim Stephenson. Additional repertoire includes **ROMANCE** by William Grant Still, **DEEP RIVER** by H.T. Burleigh, **LULLABY** by Ellen Rowe and trio movements from Max Bruch and Daniel Schnyder.

CONCERT4aCAUSE was co-founded by Kathryn Goodson and Chris Grapentine at Northside Community Church in 2008. First Baptist Church became a co-sponsor in 2015. 29 concerts have been presented so far, honoring the hard work and successes of nearly as many nonprofits, mostly local, but some as far away as South Africa.
